COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course is for students with no former drawing experience. Students draw natural and human-made forms from observation directed toward realistic rendering of objects. Topics include pictorial composition and perspective and an introduction to drawing media. Students will also be required and encouraged to assess their work and the work of others during class critiques and discussions.

• **SLO:** "Examine and evaluate work in terms of strengths and goals. Create drawings that demonstrate understanding of proportion, value, volume, composition, chiaroscuro and perspective and techniques of pencil, ink and charcoal application."

CLASS WORK, HOMEWORK, SKETCHBOOK

Keep, sign and date ALL of your class drawings. They should be stored in a flat portfolio. You will be asked to submit most of your drawings twice during the semester. Assignments will consist of in-class AND outside drawings. Expect an average of 3 hours of outside work per week. Homework and sketchbook assignments are generally assigned on Thursdays. Homework is generally due the following Tuesday, and sketchbooks are generally due the following Thursday.

HANDOUTS

Handouts are assigned each Thursday. Have them printed and in your possession by each following Tuesday. If a student is absent on the day it is due, it is the student's responsibility to show it to me upon return to class in order to get credit for it.

Please note assignments will be graded down by 1/3 grade for each day of the week they are late. I will accept late work up to 1 week after due date.
